Omitting a conversion command does not necessarily confuse the meaning of code. STRTRIM is a command that always operates on strings. Even the official documentation says, "If this argument is not a string, it is converted using IDL's default formatting rules."

So, an "IDL purist" might as well argue to omit a redundant conversion command ;-)
