This is a great program. I just hacked XWINDOW.PRO and PS_FORM.PRO a little bit to add print buttons which spawn PrintFile. PrintFile in turn spawns GhostScript and sends the converted file to a non PS printer. This lets me use all the great features of xwindow to create a predictable postscript file, as well as printing the file directly to a non postscript printer. This way I get an immediate hardcopy, and a saved file. I've never had reliable results with other ways of dumping a plot to a printer without alot of extra code in my plotting programs.
