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Joe Zawodny writes:

```
>> I'm trying to write an interactive version of the procedure in David
>> Fanning's book that makes an iso-surface of a head (p. 125)
>>
>> Anyway...
>>
>> The compiler insist on reading my REPEAT BEGIN statement as an & END
>> statement.
>>
>> Why?
```

The purpose of a REPEAT statement is to perform the loop test at the END of the loop, instead of at the beginning. Thus, the correct syntax is:

REPEAT statement UNTIL test

For a multiple-statement REPEAT the syntax will look like this:

```
REPEAT BEGIN
  Statement1
  Statement2
ENDREP UNTIL test
```
