> These two expressions perform the same operation:

>

> a = '355'OB ; SINGLE QUOTE FORM > a = "355b ; DOUBLE QUOTE FORM

>

> I believe the first form should always be preferred.

This takes *all* the fun out of adding octal codes to your programs. I'm *completely* against it. :^)
