>> Height = MSB(most significant bits) \* 256 + LSB(least significant bits)

Whoops! I wrote:

> height = Byte(data, 0) \* 256 + Byte(data, 1)

And I probably should have written:

height = Byte(data, 1) \* 256 + Byte(data, 0)

I think I wrote my test number incorrectly. :-(

You also have to pay attention to where this data was created and what kind of machine you are working on. For example, if this data was created on a UNIX machine and I'm reading it on my PC, then I have to swap the MSB and LSB when I read the data file.

OpenR, lun, filename, /Get\_Lun, /Swap\_If\_Little\_Endian
