I agree, that string comparisons are case sensitive. However, the online documentation for `cdf_control`:

> VARIABLE  
> Set this keyword to a name or index to set the current variable. For  
example,  
>  
> CDF\_CONTROL, id, VAR='MyData', SET\_INITIALRECS=20  
>  
> specifies that the variable MyData should have 20 records written to it  
initially.

did not sound like a string comparison to me.
