distribution has the compatibility rpm called compat-glibc-5.2-2.0.7.1.i386.rpm.

But, I don't know how to use it for IDL. Doea anybody know about it?

Common sense tells me that commercial software vendors like IDL should package all the static libraries instead of shared libraries. Oh, well...

I am going back to RedHat 5.2....
