No.

N_Elements() returns the number of elements in a variable. If that variable was a (10,10) array then N_Elements would return 100. If however the variable is undefined (which of course is its own special variable type in IDL), then N_Elements returns 0.

If the keyword is set, but set to a negative number then N_Elements will return will return a positive number of elements still. If the parameter is simply a flag then you're much better off with the Keywrod_Set() EQ 0 idea.
