"The Coyote Cookbook: an IDL Project Building Block System" It would come with a complete set of building blocks, similar to your example programs; but it would be a complete set, with which one could easily build up an application. In a way, it would be an alternative to IDL's GUI builder - or maybe I should say the opposite of, since it would consist of content, instead of an attempt at the outward form. Example building blocks would be a file selection menu, a plotting tool like XWindow, a floating point slider, object data handling tools, and numerous other small blocks, that could be assembled easily into an application where the data flow is handled well and the whole things integrates into a clean application. Thus it would get people up and running faster at building mid- to large-size projects.
