Bernard Puc wrote:

> For the Linux users, does anyone know why the keyword `TLB_Frame_Attr` to  
> the `Widget_Base` function is ignored? I am using the KDE window manager.

The `TLB_FRAME_ATTR` keyword is also ignored on Windows, whether you are running IDL under Windows, or are logged in to a remote host running IDL under Unix. I'm willing to bet it's ignored on MacOS as well (anyone care to confirm this?). For example, the following code is supposed to create a base widget with no system menu:

```
base = widget_base(tlb_frame_attr=2)
widget_control, base, /realize
```

Because of this unreliable behavior, I don't use the `TLB_FRAME_ATTR` keyword. Another reason to avoid this keyword is that creating widgets which can't be moved, resized, or closed normally is completely non-intuitive for users.
