Though you'd need to tell us more, I suspect what is happening is that, since XManager,/NO\_BLOCK returns immediately, the MAP pointer, which was supposed to be set when the widget was closed or finishing up (perhaps in a clean-up routine or event manager routine), is not set at that point, but that code past XManager is trying to make use of it. It's difficult to return things to the command line with NO\_BLOCK widgets, though it can be done with pointers passed in, but not in-line.

Could be way off, but it's a guess.
