Has a fully implemented emacs mode, as well as vi. Best yet, it runs not only on Windows, but a broad spectrum of UNIX flavors as well. Displays a sidebar navigation tool with links to all procedures (PRO), functions (FUNCTION), etc. that are in your source code. One click and you're there.

I couldn't get by without it.
