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I always have cases when my graphs from IDL for publications produce, let's say, not quite desired colors when printed. I can't blame it on IDL as they look fine on the screen, its the RGB to CMYK conversion. Color typesetting was much better with that then our costly color laser jet. However, even for grayscale graphs, I switched to always editing IDL ps files in a more suited for that graphics package, like Adobe Illustrator or Corel Draw. They at least have the ability to show on the screen how is it going to look like on the paper, and then you can tweak the colors, shades of gray, etc.
