> Does this mean that a PostScript file created with object graphics will print
> differently on different printers? That would be very bad.

I don't think so (although I'm sure someone is going to test it for us). Object graphics usually does things correctly. But they do appear to have access to information they are not sharing with the rest of us.

And, anyway, object graphics are positioned in the printer window in a completely different way than direct graphics are positioned in the PRINTER device.
