Subject: HELP: Linux can't run IDL\_LMGRD

Has anyone had the following error:

I have RedHat 7 Linux on a Pentium III, and when I run  
\$IDL\_DIR/bin/lmgrd  
I am told:

idl\_lmgrp: No such file or directory

Yet, the executable (\$IDL\_DIR/bin/bin.linux.x86/idl\_lmgrp) is there.  
The unix "file" command says:

idl\_lmgrp: ELF 32-bit LSB executable, Intel 80386, version 1,  
dynamically linked (uses shared libs), stripped

Compare this with the IDL executable itself:

idl: ELF 32-bit LSB executable, Intel 80386, version 1, dynamically  
linked (uses shared libs), not stripped

Both have the same permissions:

```
-rwxr-xr-x  3 root  users  1308339 Sep 26 11:09 idl*  
-rwxr-xr-x  1 root  users  414956 Sep 26 11:09 idl_lmgrp*
```

This is NOT a path or IDL environment problem. I can't even run  
idl\_lmgrp by hand like:

```
csh> /usr/local/lib/idl_5.4/bin/bin.linux.x86/idl_lmgrp
```

I get:

```
/usr/local/lib/idl_5.4/bin/bin.linux.x86/idl_lmgrp: Command not found.
```

Any help GREATLY appreciated.
