If runaway IDL processes are begin created by cron, then killing them after the fact would seem to be treating the symptom and not the disease. Do the IDL scripts created by your cron job have adequate error handling? Does each IDL script invoked by cron have an EXIT statement at the end?

To kill runaway jobs, you might be able to parse the output of 'ps', e.g.,

IDL> spawn, 'ps -ef | fgrep idl | sort', result

Don't kill the IDL license manager though...
