> plot, x, y, thick = 2
>
> fails to make a thick line in the postscript output file.
> Anyone know why, and how to remedy this?

Oh, I think it is working. It is just that a line in a PostScript file is **very** thin. A two pixel line is **still** very thin, depending upon the resolution of your PostScript device. I find I have to bump thicknesses up by a factor of about 5 or so to see noticeable differences on my printer.
