> What else, if anything, can I do to get IDL to find "myprog"?

I think you might need to add the path to your default .profile/.login/.cshrc/.whatever (which I am assuming you're not doing - I really can't tell from "I tried to append the /usr1/guest/bin/ directory to my UNIX path before starting an IDL session")

I *think* when you use SPAWN, the subsequent shell in which the SPAWN command argument is executed is *not* the one you started IDL in and therefore has no knowledge of what you may have explicitly defined. The same sort of thing happens in make files in Unix.
