I usually don't like the built-in "vectorized" text in IDL, so when I make plots in postscript, I use the command !p.font=0 to use intrinsic Postscript fonts. However, when it writes the numbers on the axes, it uses  $2 * 10^8$  instead of  $2 \times 10^8$  (i.e., I'd prefer x as the multiplication symbol.) Also, how does one use superscripts and special characters (Angstrom sign) when one uses !p.font=0?
