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I know they told us not to do this, but...

Anyone who looked into Xmanager saw that it uses event directing loops.

It tracks managed widgets using common blocks. However, WIDGET_CONTROL must have an internal reference to WIDGET_EVENT, because the following snippet works in a fresh IDL session, with no Xmanager common blocks established:

Anybody knows why and how does the above work?

This makes me wonder, why do we need Xmanager with its loops?

Besides, the online help says that an Event_pro or Event_func are called by Widget_event using widget's ID as an argument. As far as I could see, the widget's event structure is passed as an argument instead. Oh well.

A typo, I guess.
