- > Rebooting sometimes solves the problem but not always.
- > Does anyone have the answer to this intermittent problem?

Are you sure the "plots" lies are drawn, but are the same color as the background? I.e. a color problem. The reason I ask is a similar thing happended to me today when I used COLOR=255. I don't know enough about the WRITE\_PNG routine to know if this is the issue or not (at least for the first PLOTS although the second might screw up also if the color table is weird).
