That's actually the current release, which is a few months old.

- > But, as I'm trying it out, I'm quickly discovering that under Windows,
- > it doesn't DO much :-(

The only thing IDLWAVE doesn't do under Windows is run IDL as a sub-process. All of the editing, keyword/routine completion, syntax coloring, help lookup, shadow detection, etc. stuff is available, as far as I know. For someone used to IDLDE, it doesn't have as much of the functionality "up front" (and in your way). Maybe you need to read the tutorial? That said, you will be happier playing with it on your Linux box. Certain features rely on interacting with the IDL shell (such as, "which routines are compiled", etc.).
