> ...all of the examples I can find in chapter 7 of the IDL 5.3
> External Development Guide (EDG) show the C routines to have the form:
>
> function_name (int argc, void* argv[])
>

The IDL 5.0 advanced development guide p.57 was what stumped me (yeah, old manual but the only one I had). It has a beautiful sum_array program that accepts arguments directly rather than by the command line type interface so I just assumed this was OK.

Now with *the knowledge* I notice that all other examples are in (argc,argv) form and a sentence on p.49 telling me that "Any routines called by CALL_EXTERNAL should be defined with a prototype similar to...[the (argc,argv) format]." Note "should" rather than "MUST AT ALL COSTS AND WITHOUT FAIL" and "similar to" rather than "EXACTLY, COMPLETELY IDENTICAL TO" !!
