Hi Ken--

Does something like STATUSLINE help you? [Assumes you are running on an ANSI-like terminal.] I use ANSI escape characters to control the cursor position, so it's not portable to every type of terminal. As I recall, I couldn't find a simply way to reposition the cursor using FORMAT statements.
