I don't know how STATUSLINE works or what can be termed "simple", but the following small modification to Ken's code (putting a CR in the format string) works on VT-52 compatible terminals (is that the same as ANSI?). I think it fails on Windows though (because the CR makes a new line there). Here it is:

FOR i = 0, 10 DO PRINT, i, FORMAT = '(\$, "i = ", I4, "'+STRING(13B)+'")'
