I presume you want to make an MPEG movie out of a sequence of JPEG images. Is this correct? There is a (fairly dated) article on how to create MPEG movies on my web page:

The example uses a 3D data set and creates it's own 24-image from each frame of the data. You won't have to go to this trouble, since each of your JPEG images is probably 24-bit already. You will add your JPEG images to the MPEG object (using MPEG_Put) directly.
