The people who wrote Cray's DMF (Data Migration Facility) software obviously weren't expecting any Windows users on their system. You can check in files with spaces in their names any time you like, but you can't get them back! Even with a GUI.

- > Of course, power Unix users know they have a better list of command
- > line utilities at their disposal than Windows users, so they're
- > tempted to leave their GUI's more often. :-)

I stand corrected. I should have said that "Unix people look down their noses at us Windows users because we're foolish enough to use file names with spaces in the middle *and* because we don't know how to use command-line tools".
