Much simpler than ResEdit hacking is to use a type-and-creator-changer utility such as the freeware FinderInfo, with a nice drag-and-drop usage, and you can tell it to be "just like this other file here". Find it in one of the sumex-aim archives/mirrors in Utilities directory.
