- > at small font sizes on the display, but they print
- > wonderfully well.

Beware if you plan to 'tweak' Postscript plots containing Truetype fonts using something like Adobe Illustrator. Truetype fonts are drawn in Postscript output as polygons, not 'hardware' fonts. You cannot edit them using the usual text editing tools.

My rule of thumb is: Hershey fonts for the screen; Postscripts fonts for hardcopy, except for 3-D plots, when you have to use Truetype fonts to get the 3-D rotation right.
