- > In IDL 5.4 on Mac OS X, I could simply type
- > .reset session--the memory of that object
- > would be expunged, AND (!) IDL would re-run
- > my startup.pro file so I'd have a true, fresh session
- > with all of my default parameters set up like new.

That's funny. In IDL 5.4 (and later) on Windows the startup file is not re-run.

- > I've noticed that in IDL 5.6 (Mac, Linux, Sun) typing
- > .reset or .reset session starts things anew, but
- > doesn't run my startup.pro file. It's now necessary
- > to exit and restart IDL.

Er...you could run the startup file yourself.

I've bound a macro to run the startup script to a handy key. I use it immediately after .reset_session. (I tried a script that would reset the session *then* run the startup script. Not surprisingly, this didn't work as executive commands cannot be called from scripts.)
