I use DISPLAY to do this. It is object based but you don't have to think of it this way - it is command-line driven. You can specify to keep the coordinate system for each Display window, and you can have as many open at the same time as your screen will fit. Plus, you get legends, colors, mouse-click for plot deletion, moveable text labels, and ROI.
