There is the PostScript part of the file, which is only used when the file is printed, and the screen version part, (sometimes called the preview image) which is used to give you something to look at in your document. That's what you have been basing your PostScript views on.

But the preview is to real PostScript output as storebought tomatoes are to those you grow in the garden. That is to say, they are the same in name only.

If you had a chance to print your output, you would realize that immediately. Just as when you eat a real tomato the juice always drips down your chin.
