- > so that I don't sometimes have to wait several minutes for a plot to
- > finish? I'm using IDL under Windows, and Ctrl-C doesn't make any
- > impression while PLOT is running.

Sorry, I don't think you can interrupt PLOT. Under Windows' cooperative multi-tasking, programs have to be explicitly written to yield control of the CPU, and the IDL built-in routines don't seem to do this.

It is possible (with minimal effort) to write IDL procedures so that they can be interrupted--contact me if you want to know how. But this only lets you interrupt IDL between commands, not during them.
