Take a look at Ronn Kling's IDL2AVI .dlm available on his website www.kilvarock.com. It is a windows only dlm which provides an interface to the video for windows API. You can read and write MPEG files if they have been encoded in the AVI file format. I know at least one person has had a problem with IDL2AVI and winXP but this never was resolved on the list so I don't know where it stands. I have been meaning to try it myself on XP but just haven't had the time.

If you are encoding these files yourself and they are scientific animations then you may want to consider a codec better suited for the task such as the ligos Indeo Video 5 codec or the Sorenson codec which ships with QuickTime pro.

If you take David's advice, some of the best MPEG players you can get for the PC are the DVD players that often come bundled with your PC. PowerDVD or WinDVD. I just don't know if they play MPEG-1 encoded files.
