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Hi Adrian,

I've had some success connecting IDL to a Logitech WebCam using their API and the new IDL ActiveX widgets. To get the images into IDL, you either have to use file transfer (ugly and slow, but very simple:-) or do some fancy footwork with C++. Whilst doing a search the other day I noticed an API that claimed to connect to any webcam from C++, so you might be able to do the same thing with another brand of camera.

I have also written a serial port program for one of my customers in C++. I used an excellent tool called UserPort (you will need this if you are on WinNT, 2000 or XP) and created a DLL using MSVC++6.0. This was simply called from IDL using CALL_EXTERNAL (which I put into a wrapper routine).

I hope this is useful. Let me know if you need any more details.
