> The most important thing I want to do with plots is zoom in on subsets
> of data. For example, if the initial X range is from 0 to 10 and I
> see an interesting feature between 3 and 4, then I want to interactively
> reset the X range to [3,4]. I can do this manually with IPLOT, by
> clicking on the Visualization browser and then clicking on PLOT and
> entering new values of the X minimum and maximum
> But ideally, this could be done interactively by clicking over the
> desired range, as in Paul van Delst's program WPLOT

Try the "plot zoom" feature. It is the 4th button in the manipulator toolbar. Its tooltip is "Data Range". It is much easier than entering numbers into the property sheet.
