- > vector form, depending on the setting of the VECTOR keyword.

- > However to the best of my knowledge, vector Postscript output is not
- > available from iTools. There are probably two reasons for this:

- > * Nobody got around to it
- > * Vector renditions of object graphics have various peculiarities
- > and limitations, as described in the documentation.

I realize the VECTOR keyword is available for the CLIPBOARD object, but I think this is a hacked together vector approximation rather than a true vector engine, in the sense that IDL writes true vector output in direct graphics PostScript. I think they would have "gotten around to it" if it had been any good. I suspect they are waiting to do it right before they talk about it.

For what it's worth, I always hear "yes, yes, yes" whenever I bring it up with them. :-)
