Michael Wallace writes:

- > For the plot (or similar) procedure, the Y axis title is always spaced
- > relative to the longest label on the Y axis. This ensures that the
- > title never collides with any of the labels. Is there a way to
- > determine where the title was positioned? For my purposes, I just need
- > the X coordinate of the position. I have some additional information I
- > want to put to the left of the title, but to know where to put it, I
- > have to know where the title is first.

I wish there was a way to determine where the axis title was positioned, but I've never discovered it. I've always thought the Y axis should be positioned with the same relative gap as exists with the X axis title and its associated annotation. The Y gap seems too close to me.
