When implemented correctly, as shown in the example programs in the book (e.g., wgetname.pro and wpaint.pro in Chapter 9), this technique works just fine.

If this technique does not work in your code, I suspect there is something wrong with your code. However, you have not provided enough of your code for inspection. You might want to try shortening your program to the minimum number of lines that reproduces the error. This process may well fix the bug in your code. Otherwise, post the entire program in your next message.
