True, but I assumed the OP needed to close ALL open files because an error occurred, or you've inserted a STOP statement in your code. Then, when you get tossed back out to the IDL prompt you do something like:

```
IDL> close, /all IDL> retall
```

although I now prefer the more bull-in-a-china-shop method,

IDL> .reset session

:o)

So, to the OP, I personally *never* use CLOSE,/ALL in "real" IDL code. Just in the debug parts.
