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Tobi writes:

> is there an existing idl routine that returns a filename suffix?
>
> i have chosen a number of files using the DIALOG_PICKFILE() routine
> and now want to do different things depending on the suffix (IMG, JPG,
> GFX ...) of the file chosen.

There is a FILE_DIRNAME function for getting the directory part of a file path. And a FILE_BASENAME function for getting the base filename part of a file path. But, oddly I think, neither gives you the opportunity to get the file extension. (Although it is certainly not hard to extract the extension from a base filename.)

So I've written my own function, FSC_BASE_FILENAME, that can give you the base filename, the directory, and the file extension, all at once. For example:

```
IDL> path = 'C:\RSI\David\Catalyst\catcoord__define.pro'
IDL> basename = FSC_BASE_FILENAME(path, Directory=dir, Extension=ext)
IDL> Print, dir
      C:\RSI\David\Catalyst\
IDL> Print, basename
      catcoord__define
IDL> Print, ext
      pro
```

I only use this program in interactive programs, so the input is expected to come from something like Dialog_Pickfile or Filepath. I haven't tested it on anything else. :-)
