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This morning I found a workaround. Not very nice, but it works:

In the license/lmgrd.opt file I excluded the users, which run the Virtual Machine:

GROUP PROCESSES abcd efgh

EXCLUDE idl GROUP PROCESSES

Nevertheless the behaviour (feature) of the license manager is quite nasty:

As long as it can get a license from the pool, it takes it. If not, it looks for other possibilities. On my notebook IDL runs under a 'personal use' license, but if the notebook is connected to our network, it occupies a license from the pool.

Any other ideas?
