I work in the space sciences community, so I know exactly what you're talking about. A number of my scientists use Macs for the reason you mention. They actually want to know a little of how to do their own IDL magic. Many of our young scientists use IDL and know some things better than I do, not that I have any great expansive IDL knowledge. It'd take a miracle for them to upgrade from FORTRAN 77 to FORTRAN 90. At least since they're so senior they don't bug me too much -- they have their postdocs bug me. :-)
