> iplot. Normally I would use !p.multi to set the number of plots I want,  
> however this doesn't affect the iplot window. Is there a similar  
> command, or setting to do this?

What I do is to set Window -> Layout to "Gridded", say 2 x 2. I haven't really figured out how to plot into the other windows from within the iTool (there are many things which confuse me, e.g. do I have to insert a data space or a visualization? I don't know). But one way to do it is to mark the frame you want to plot in with the mouse (it will get a red border) and then, from the command line, do

IDL> iplot, x, y, /overplot

I'd like to hear more about putting different plots, images etc. into one iTool. Another problem I ran into was when I put, say, 4 x 6 images into one ilimage, it got so slow that you could barely work with it any more. I'd also like to know if I can put two plots into one frame, without gridding the window (which would allow me to put a text box with a title above both of them).
