Hmm... here's what my XEmacs (21.4.17) says after IDLWAVE loads:

```
=====  
'cancel-timer' is a compiled Lisp function  
  -- loaded from "timer"  
(cancel-timer TIMER)
```

Documentation:
Remove TIMER from the list of active timers.

```

```

It is from the "timer.el" file which is part of the fsf-compat package (or should be). Maybe check to see if you have that file in your package? You might force it to be loaded by putting:

```
(require 'timer)
```

in your .emacs (or .xemacs/init.el), but that shouldn't strictly be necessary, if the autoloads are setup correctly. Let me know if this does the trick, and I may throw a (require 'timer) in.
