As far as I understand the IDLffXMLDOM\* objects, retrieving the XMLDOMElement (or XMLDOMNode which is the superclass) of the "sensor"-tag is all you need to do. Passing this you just pass the tag and all of its sub-tags but nothing more.

Well it involves object-creation and copying of data, but it seems to be the most straightforward way.
