But eventually I come to a "sensor" tag that is significantly different from all the other tags in the file, and needs to be processed differently.

What I would like to do, and what I have been led to believe other languages allow you to do, is take that whole tag, with all of its sub-tags, out of that file and send it somewhere else for processing. I can't seem to make out how to do that among the millions (alright, *thousands*) of XML objects sitting here in front of me. :-(
