> worked fine for me. The only question that I'd like to now if is there
> any possibility to make the same think not interactively but through a
> batch file. I do not want to occupy the cpu of my server with this kind
> of stuff but just want to make it not interactively. I generally to
> this by creating an IDL programs and then use on linux the at command
> with low priority. The problem is that in this way no interactive
> xwindowing and consequently tv or tvim fails....
> maybe some of you have some ideas

Why don't you use the IMAGE keyword to MPEG_PUT instead of the WINDOW keyword. The former loads the frame directly with an image, whereas the latter takes a copy of of the current graphics window as the image it loads. Be sure you BYTSCL your image as you put it into the MPEG object. That way you have no need of a window or a TV substitute command (TVIMAGE, IMGDISP, PLOTIMAGE, etc.)
