JPEGs should be fine, or bitmaps or whatever, with various ways to export using those, including a standard option in the iTools.

I recall pooh-poohing a copy in the (fairly distant) past as arrays only went up to 255 subscripts but that is \*not\* listed in the current limitations of the product.
