> appropriately then launches IDL.

> The robust solution would be to write a script that inserts your
> hostname into the license.dat file and then launches IDL. Probably
> quite simple. You could use sed or awk.
>
> Maybe I am missing something. It's been a long time since I dealt with
> node locked licenses on UNIX...
